Nurse Practitioner

The Nurse Practitioner will work with the CMHA Cochrane Timiskaming Branch's primary care and mental health teams to provide a continuum of services for individuals living with serious and persistent mental illness.

Summary of Duties and Responsibilities:

- Conducts the medical assessments, including obtaining medical histories, performing physical exams, and interpreting laboratory studies for the purpose of diagnosis and providing treatment of individuals with serious mental illnesses and those who have common medical illnesses with concomitant mental health difficulties;
- Collaborates with members of an interdisciplinary health team to plan, implement, co-ordinate and evaluate patient care in consultation with patients and their families:
- Provides appropriate medical directives that complement those provided by physicians;
- Assists in conceptualizing, developing and implementing public education activities and awareness campaigns relating to primary care and mental illness;
- Prescribes and administers drugs according to established policies and protocols;
- Coordinates services to assess, plan, link, guide and advocate which are directed to chronic mentally disabled individuals;
- Provides leadership, advice and counsel on the provision of research-based care utilizing critical analysis;
- Utilizes, implements and promotes research findings through presentations and/or publications;
- Maintains productive relationships with agency staff, medical staff, and other health
 professionals and the community through leadership, collaboration and
 consultation in the execution of primary health care programs and individualized
 client treatment and care.

Qualifications:

- Certificate of Competence from the College of Nurses of Ontario
- Registered Nurse in the Extended Class and completion of a university program for Primary Health Care Nurse Practitioners
- Current Clinical nursing experience in the community and with individuals living with mental illness will be considered an asset
- Knowledge and understanding of the Mental Health Act and recent amendments
- Possession of a valid drivers' license and have the use of a reliable vehicle for work purposes
