Addictions & Mental Health Workers

The CMHA Cochrane Timiskaming Branch is currently recruiting Addictions & Mental Health Workers who are members of a multi-disciplinary team and who play key roles in the coordination of care and services for clients who are affected by addictions and/or serious mental illness. The Workers recognize and respect the individuality and uniqueness of each client, including their needs, values, beliefs, and choices.

Following a community-based model, the Workers provide a range of services including, but not limited to, intake, assessment, referral, case management, treatment and counselling, outreach, social rehabilitation, community support, psychiatric consultation, and after care. The Workers facilitate support groups in collaboration with their agency colleagues and other community partners to enable clients to live an optimal quality of life in the community according to their own needs and choices. The Workers also provide support and guidance to the family members, perform crisis intervention, and facilitate public education events on mental illness and substance abuse.

Requirements:

1. Candidates should possess a Bachelor's Degree in Social Work or a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology. Other Bachelor's degrees with significant relevant mental health and addictions experience and training may also be considered;
2. Experience in the mental health and addictions field would be an asset;
3. Registration with the Ontario College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers would be an asset;
4. The ability to work with a population of clients with diverse and complex issues;
5. Valid driver's licence and use of a reliable vehicle for work purposes.
